### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone quarterly financial results of Cosmo Ferrites Limited (the company) for the quarter ended 31<sup>st</sup> March,2020 and the year to date results for the period from 1<sup>st</sup> April,2019 to 31<sup>st</sup> March,2020, attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us these standalone financial results:

- i. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations inthis regard; and
- ii. give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter ended 31<sup>st</sup> March,2020 as well as the year to date results for the period from 1<sup>st</sup> April,2019 to 31<sup>st</sup>March,2020.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results section of our report. ### **Emphasis of Matter**

We draw attention to Note 4 to the standalone financial results, which describes the uncertainties and the impact of Covid-19 pandemic on the Company's operations and results as assessed by the management. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

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# Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Standalone Financial Statements

These financial resultshave been prepared on the basis of the standalone annual financial statements. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation of these financial results that give a true and fair view of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information in accordance with the applicable accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

- 1 The above statement of audited financial result was taken on record by the Board of Directors in their meeting held on June 23, 2020. The statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified audit opinion on these results.
- 2 These standalone financial results have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind-AS) as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 3 of the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and relevant amendment rules thereunder
- 3 The company has adopted Ind AS 116 'Leases' effective April 1, 2019. However, there is no impact on the profits of the company
- 4 The outbreak of Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic globally and in India led to the suspension of operations of the Company during the lockdown period and has impacted the overall business activities of the Company. The management has exercised due care in concluding on significant accounting judgements and estimates, inter-alia, recoverability of receivables, impairment assessment of financial and non-financial assets, realisability of Inventory and the overal liquidity. The management believes that with the financial support measures being extended by the Company's bank, the Company will be able to discharge the future liabilities as and when falling due. The Company will continue to monitor current and future conditions and impact thereof on Company's operations.
- 5 Exceptional items in the previous period represented one time loss due to discontinuation of LED operations. During the year, some of the remaining assets and liabilities of the discontinued operations were disposed off/settled resulting in further loss (net) Rs 2 lakhs.
